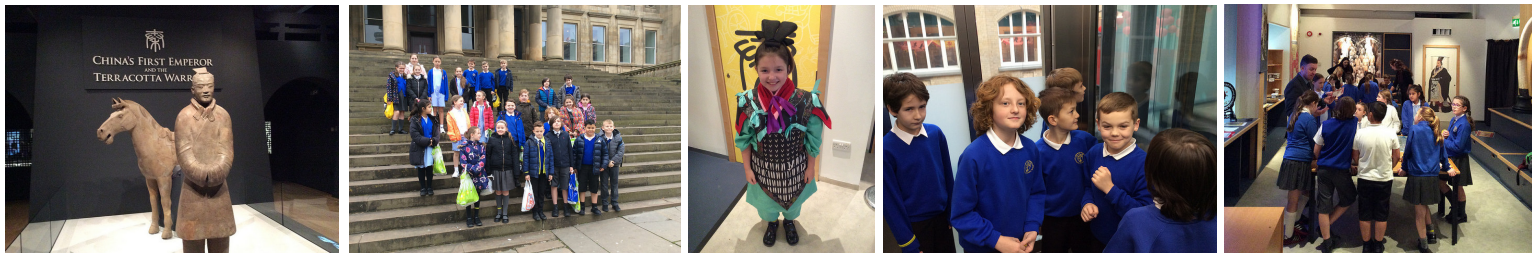
PSHE Afternoon with LFC
