The Very Hungry Caterpillar Workshops with Chartwells.

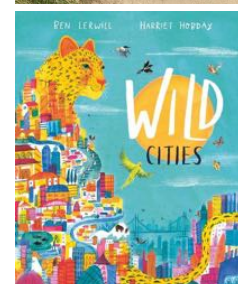
