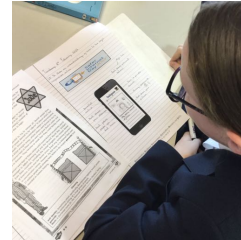




Safer Internet Day 2022

Supersonic Scientists in Year 5

As part of their science topic on 'Materials', the Super Scientists of Year 5 spent their lesson this week investigating the solubility of materials. By mixing materials such as sand, sugar, flour and coffee with water, the children were able to determine whether a material was soluble or insoluble. Pupils looked at the different variables required in this investigation and identified that changes to variables, such as the temperature of water used, can lead to very different outcomes! Scientific investigations are a vital element of the learning process, and here at Florence Melly, we use investigations frequently and throughout the curriculum so that pupils can discover new ideas, gain a better understanding the world around them and develop their scientific thinking.
