

Universal Consent Form

This is a gentle reminder for parents/carers to complete the Universal Consent Form, issued by Mr Baillie last week. This form helps us to collate vitally important information about your child - it is essential that we receive the completed forms as soon as possible. Allergens and School Dinners

This is an important update for parents/carers around our approach to dealing with incidents relating to pupils who come to school with a packed lunch but they cannot eat it because it has been lost, spoilt or inedible (for whatever reason). In recent weeks we have dealt with several incidents like this and we felt that it was necessary to inform all parents of what we can and cannot do in these circumstances.

If there is a problem with a packed lunch, the affected pupil will be offered a jacket potato with/without beans instead. Understandably, Chartwells (the company who run our school dinners) cannot offer any thing other than this because of potential allergen issues. If in the very unlikely event that your child's packed lunch is inedible and they do not like jacket potato, we will call parents/carers to bring in a replacement lunch.

We hope that parents/carers understand the reasoning behind this approach.

School Uniform and PE Kits

First and foremost, a huge thank you to parents/carers for making every effort to send your child/children into school wearing the correct uniform. We are very grateful and the children look so smart and proud.

We have noticed some children coming into school in the incorrect school uniform (especially on their designated PE day). Please make every effort to send your child into school in the correct uniform. We will be contacting parents/carers when this is the case to see how we can best support you to ensure that your child is wearing the correct uniform.
