

The Nest is our enhanced provision base which supports some pupils who have SEND, particularly those with communication and interaction difficulties. The provision is highly personalised to each pupil and it provides the opportunity for pupils to access a broad and balanced curriculum at an appropriate level within a nurturing environment. Learning in the Nest is highly structured and each day of the week has a specific focus, such as; Therapy Tuesday when the children engage in Bucket Therapy and Friendsday Wednesday when learning focuses on turn taking and positively interacting with peers.

Re-launching our behaviour policy and Class Dojo - On Monday, Mr Leach relaunched the school's behaviour policy and Class Dojo rewards with informative assemblies for pupils in Year 1 to Year 6. Over the next few weeks, we will be introducing lots of new initiatives like weekly trips out for exceptional behaviour and inviting parents/carers into school for our Friday Celebration Assembly to see their child collect a new 'Core Values Award' which will be replacing 'Student of the Week' certificates. All very exciting indeed. This is in response to an increase in more challenging and undesirable behaviour in school. At Florence Melly Community Primary, we pride ourselves on how exemplary our pupils' behaviour is and we want that to continue to be a real strength of our wonderful school.
