The programme itself is based upon on the National Standard for Cycle Training, and helps teach pupils the fundamentals of staying safe on the road! It is proven to develop children's confidence and resilience, whilst having mental and physical health boosting benefits! Our pupils have really enjoyed the sessions this week, and are definitely looking forward to putting their new skills to the test on on the roads!




Taking down the canopies in the EYFS
