








### The Nest - Bucket Therapy as part of Therapy Tuesdays!

This week's 'spotlight on curriculum' takes us to our Nest provision and the 'Attention Autism' sessions that the children engage with. These are often referred to as 'Bucket Therapy' sessions and form a key part of our 'Therapy Tuesdays'. This is an intervention used to support children in developing communication, interaction and attentional skills. By using highly motivating, engaging and fun activities and toys, children receive an irresistible invitation to learn. This approach means that we are more likely to get children's attention and encourage them in spontaneously joining in. It shows the children that they can have fun in group activities which in turn improves their social skills. Bucket Therapy promotes vocabulary development and particularly supports children who are non-verbal or may have limited communication skills. Long term, this approach also helps with with social skills, engagement in play, attention and behaviour.
